

Parallel spacing of cable trays



Overview

When installing two cable trays in parallel at the same height, the distance between them should be no less than 0. This spacing is crucial for adequate maintenance access, ease of inspection, and ensuring proper airflow for effective heat dissipation. When completely installed, without damage either to conductors or structural system use maintain spacing or to keep cables in place when the tray is erect the minimum bend radius for cables as they exit the bottom of the cable tray. A rung spacing of 6 to 9 inches (150 to 230 mm) is preferable when. Proper installation can significantly reduce electromagnetic interference, prevent fire hazards, and improve overall efficiency. Currently the cable tray has a mixture of cables larger than 4/0 & smaller than 4/0 in the tray which has been properly sized per the 2023 NFPA 70, section 392.
